#### **POSITION DESCRIPTION:**

Under the general direction of the Crew Leader or Parks Foreman, performs semi-skilled work and manual labor in the construction, installation, repair, and maintenance of parks, recreational areas and public grounds.

#### **ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:**

- Receives oral or written work order from Supervisor who reviews work in progress.
- Operates dump trucks (GVW 12,000lbs.), tractors, and related equipment.
- Attaches plows, mowers and other accessories to equipment.
- Drives dump truck to deliver and remove materials to and from work areas to plow snow and to remove garbage.
- Operates tractors to mow and grade playing fields and areas.
- Repairs and maintains recreational facilities and equipment; tasks include, but are not limited to, rough carpentry, painting and minor plumbing repairs.
- Uses line markers to line playing fields.
- Performs heavy manual labor in the removal of trees, debris and garbage.
- Follows standard safety procedures and regulations.
- Reports tasks accomplished orally or on written work order to Supervisor.

#### REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- Ability to use common sense understanding to carry out instructions furnished in written, oral or diagrammatic form.
- Ability to acquire skills to operate equipment.
- Ability to maintain harmonious relationships with other employees, department officials and the public.
