BARKHAMSTED FACTS & FIGURES

Location:

In northwest Connecticut in the watershed of the upper Farmington River.

Area:

39.0 square miles.

Population:

3,799 (est. 2020).

Government:

Selectmen, Town Meeting, Board of Finance.

Public Safety:

Resident State Trooper, State Police; three volunteer fire companies: Barkhamsted East (C7), Pleasant Valley (D4), Riverton (A2); Volunteer Ambulance Service.

Health Services:

Barkhamsted Elementary (D3), Northwestern Regional High School, Regional School District No. 7 (D1).

Manufacture of chairs and other specialties, precision machining.

Stancil Cove Recreation Area (D4) swimming for residents of Barkhamsted and New Hartford & general public by seasonal permit.

(E1) on West Hill Pond.

American Legion State Forest

(782 acres) and

Peoples State Forest

(2,954 acres) lie on opposite sides of the West Branch of the Farmington River. They provide opportunities for picnicking, camping, canoeing and fishing. Some trails are used for cross-country skiing.

Tunxis State Forest

(8,141 acres) lies in both Barkhamsted and Hartland. The Tunxis Trail, one of the blue-blazed trails maintained by the Connecticut Forest & Parks Association runs the length of the forest. The Forest Service road to Pine Mountain (A7) is used in winter for cross-country skiing.

Lake McDonough

(E5) owned and operated by the Water Bureau of the Metropolitan District for stream control, provides opportunity for fishing, boating, picnicking and swimming.

History:

This area was part of the land Windsor acquired for settlement, which began in 1746. The town, incorporated in 1779, was named for Berkhamsted in the English County of Hertford. Lambert Hitchcock started to make chair parts in 1818. The village around the factory was called Hitchcockville. In 1866 the name was changed to Riverton.
